Mo'z Motley Blues played live music throughout the afternoon that had people dancing and the Kid's Zone was popular with games and face painting by Skye Schumaker. Combined, the events raised close to \$10,000 for the KVFD. District Summer Projects

The District continues performing repairs and preventative maintenance from last winter, completing summer projects and getting ready for the 2017/18 winter season. Heavy snow and excessive runoff damaged the District's T-1 Communication Line which has now been repaired and improved to prevent any future damage. Three electrical cabinets have been replaced around the Valley to improve the electrical service to District customers. As many of you know, last winter was very hard on the asphalt around Kirkwood so, the District contracted Colbre Paving to complete repairs on District property. Manhole #99 in the meadow near Base Camp required repairs due to the amount of water moving through the meadow during the spring melt. Fire hydrant repairs, valve exercising for water and propane and the playground clean-up are being wrapped up before the snow flies.



Winter Preparations

Mother Nature got everyone's attention, delivering 5 inches of snow to Kirkwood on September 21st and 22nd. Now is the time to make sure your home is ready for winter! Some of the items which may need to be on your Winter Prep checklist include:

- Snow Removal Contract Executed
- Snow stakes for marking cars in place
- Water shut-off marked and accessible
- Furnace serviced and filter replaced
- Smoke & carbon monoxide detectors batteries replaced
- Wood stocked
- Hoses and landscape tools stored
- Needed insulation in place; reinforce caulking as needed
- Chimney checked and cleaned
- Propane meter protection installed

Chipper and Defensible Space Program

Over the summer, many Kirkwood homeowners have taken advantage of the FREE wood chipping program offered by the Kirkwood Volunteer Fire Department. If you still have limbs and downed trees on your property now is the time to get those chipped. Take advantage of this great program and reduce the risk of fire on your property. The Chipping Program will end when snow prohibits. Please remember that construction debris cannot be chipped and when stacking limbs to be chipped the diameter of each limb must be 6 inches or less and no more than 5 feet in length. Place your stack of limbs along the edge of the roadway with the thick end of the branch facing the road and District staff will chip the material back onto your property. Items that cannot be chipped will be left behind.
