- Suggested changes in no way reflect a lack of commitment by the community or staff

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Kirkwood Volunteer Fire Department

- Established in 1985 as strictly volunteer
 - Responds to structure fires, wildfires, explosions, medical assistance, traffic accidents, mutual requests, etc.
- Despite increase in recruiting and benefits, volunteers have not been available to provide the required manpower and <u>skills</u>
- Volunteers living off mountain cannot respond during road closures
- KVFD falls well below National Fire Protection Assoc recommendations and often has no volunteers for shifts
- KVFD ambulance services discontinued in 2019 due to lack of EMT fire department volunteers

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Funding of \$0.0396/square foot/year never updated



What We Could/Should Provide

- 2017 District adopted the Fire Service Master Plan which identified deficiencies in KVFD. 2019 – Ad Hoc committee explores funding options. 2021 – Ad Hoc committee formed to develop Special Tax.
- 24/7 coverage with minimum of two qualified personnel <u>on mountain</u> at all times
- Prompt fire suppression and medical service response times are required to reduce health risk, including deaths, and fire damage.
- The fire and emergency services resources staffed to protect the peak population of the service area.
- Example from San Francisco: Response times to the scene of a life-threatening emergency within ten minutes at least 90 percent of the time. Why? Because delayed response times increase property damage and health risk.



Resolution No. 23-03

- Authorizes the formation of Community Facilities District No. 2023-1 (Fire Services) in order to finance public services in and for such CFD
 - Public services consist of all fire protection, prevention and suppression services, including medical services, and including but not limited to costs of personnel, equipment, replacement reserves and costs incidental thereto
 - Other costs to be financed by the CFD include costs of administering the CFD, levying the Special Tax and administering the CFD



Proposed Level of Service

- Rick Ansel continuing as KVFD Fire Chief
- Contract with Amador Fire Protection District to provide personnel
- Staffing:
 - Battalion Chief (1 staff) provides program oversight and management.
 - Duty Officers (Captains) (3 staff) provides shift oversight.
 - Engineer/EMT (4 staff) firefighting and emergency medical services. Licensed to operate the fire department vehicles.
 - Firefighter/EMT (4 staff) firefighting and emergency medical services.
- Augmented by trained volunteers
- The service scenario of 100% paid full-time staff provides the highest certainty of adequately trained staff responding to an emergency
- The service scenario of paid full-time staff, augmented by some volunteers may reduce costs
 - Serious efforts will be made to reduce costs through use of trained volunteers
- Resolution 23-03 covers the maximum anticipated expenses



Resolution No. 23-04

- Calls for a special election for Community Facilities District No. 2023-1 (Fire Services)
 - ► To be held on July 11, 2023
 - Requires a two-thirds vote from the qualified electors (registered voters) within the CFD



Special Tax and Rate and Method

Special Tax explained in the Rate and Method of Apportionment

- > Apportionment is based on the peak population in the service area related to each property
- ➤ Parking spaces on <u>developed</u> properties are used as proxy for peak population
- ► Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Maximum Special Tax:
- >\$513 per parking space
- Subject to an annual escalator (2-6%)
- Residential Property
 - Single Family: Two parking spaces per dwelling unit (520 spaces)
 - Condominium: One parking space per dwelling unit, adjusted for time-share (385 spaces)
- Non-Residential Property
 - Number of parking spaces assigned at formation and updated on an annual basis (see table on next slide)


Annual Costs

Cost Breakdown

- Model D annual services: \$1,736,369 (assuming no volunteers augmenting staff)
- Annual vehicles/equipment: \$119,267
- Annual administrative expenses: \$45,000
- ≻Total: \$1,900,636
- Community donations can continue to fund KVFD equipment (which reduces costs)
- Parking spaces: 3,708
- Special Tax per parking space: \$513
